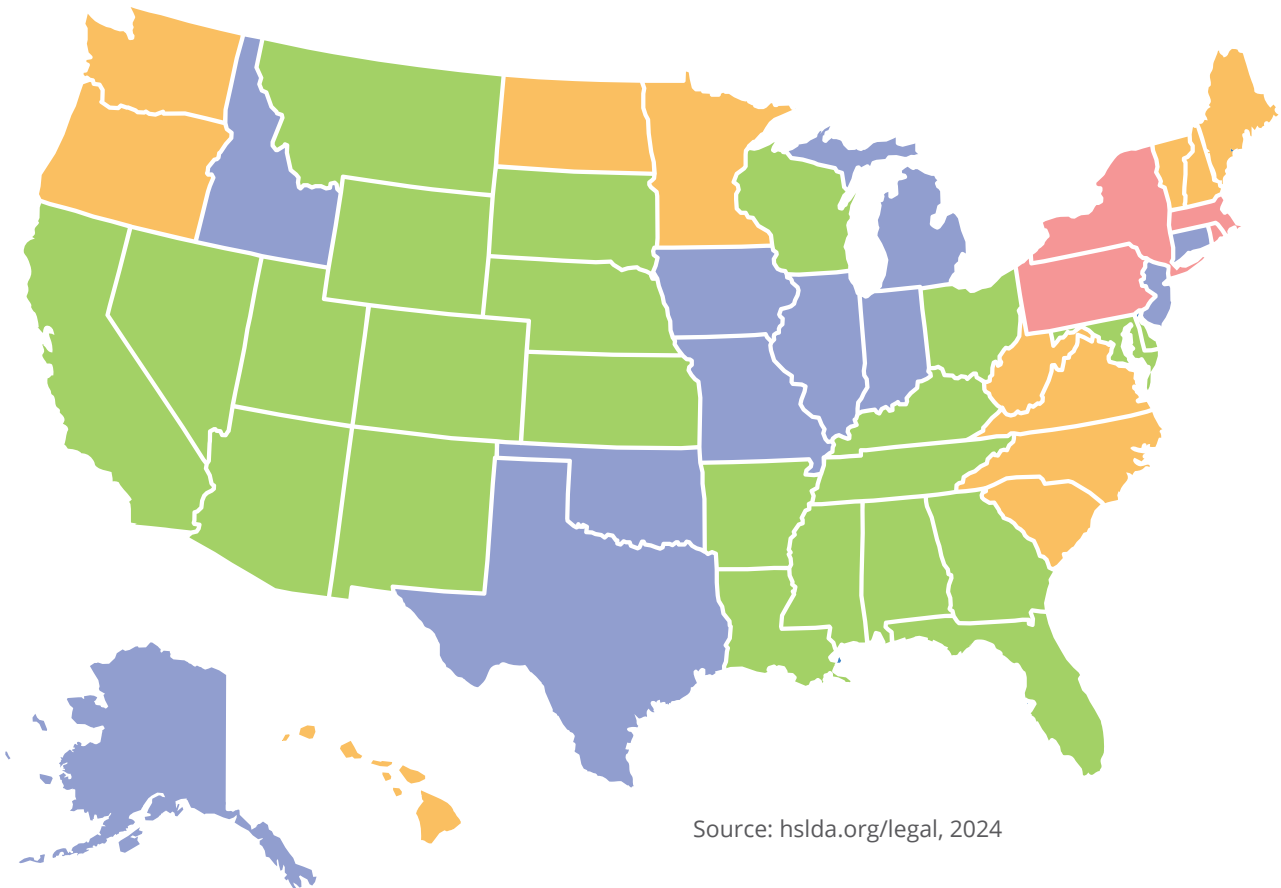

Although homeschooling is legal in all 50 states, all homeschoolers should know their state's homeschooling laws and file any necessary paperwork or meet additional requirements.



## REGULATION LEVELS





**No Requirements:** Parents do not need to initiate contact.

**Low Regulation:** Parents must notify schools.

**Moderate Regulations:** Parents must submit notification, test scores, and/or professional evaluation of student progress.

**High Regulation:** Additional requirements like curriculum approval, teacher qualification of parents, or home visits are required.

# Teacher-Led and

# Student-Led Curriculum

When it comes to choosing homeschool curriculum, there are so many different styles and nuances between techniques that it can be difficult to know which direction to take. To help you decide which option is best for your children, here are a few key differences between teacher-led and student-led curriculum.



## Teacher-led curriculum may be better for students who:

- Struggle being self-motivated
- Like to be shown how to do something
- Need encouragement while problem solving
- Have trouble focusing on their own
- Struggle reading independently
- Want a parent involved in play or discovery time



## Student-led curriculum may be better for students who:

- Are independent
- Excel at being self-motivated
- Get bored with too much explanation
- Can problem solve on their own
- Are confident when reading
- Can entertain themselves for a long time such as during play time

## So, what's the difference?

Teacher-led and student-led curriculum differ in who sets the pace of new information. In other words, who decides how quickly new information is presented?

In a teacher-led curriculum, the parent determines the timing and quantity of new information presented. Students learn according to the teacher's schedule, with new content only available through the teacher's instruction. The teacher-led model is what almost every school across the United States uses. A teacher prepares content and presents it to students. Then, the students practice the content and are assessed on it.

With a student-led curriculum, new information is always accessible for students to learn at their own pace. This approach promotes independence, allowing students to explore new content without waiting for teacher instruction.

## Don't forget!

When trying to decide between teacher-led and student-led curriculum, remember that teaching style matters as well. Teacher-led curriculum like Horizons comes with a robust teacher's guide, but more preparation work is required for the parent.

On the other hand, with student-led curriculum, instruction is written into the student workbooks, like LIFEPAK. Teacher's guides are provided so parents can be involved if needed, but even then, there is less required of parents.

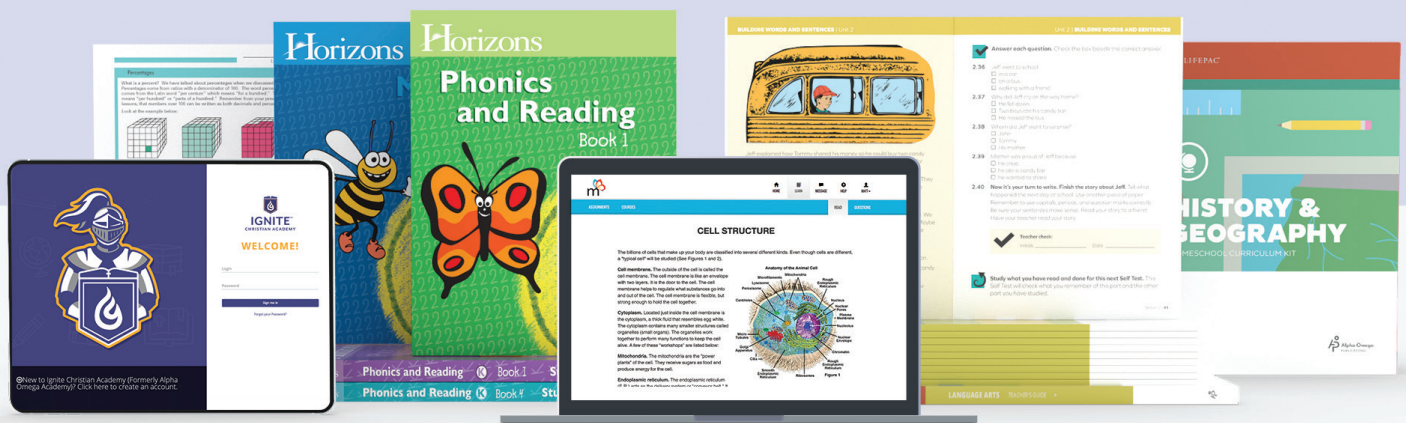
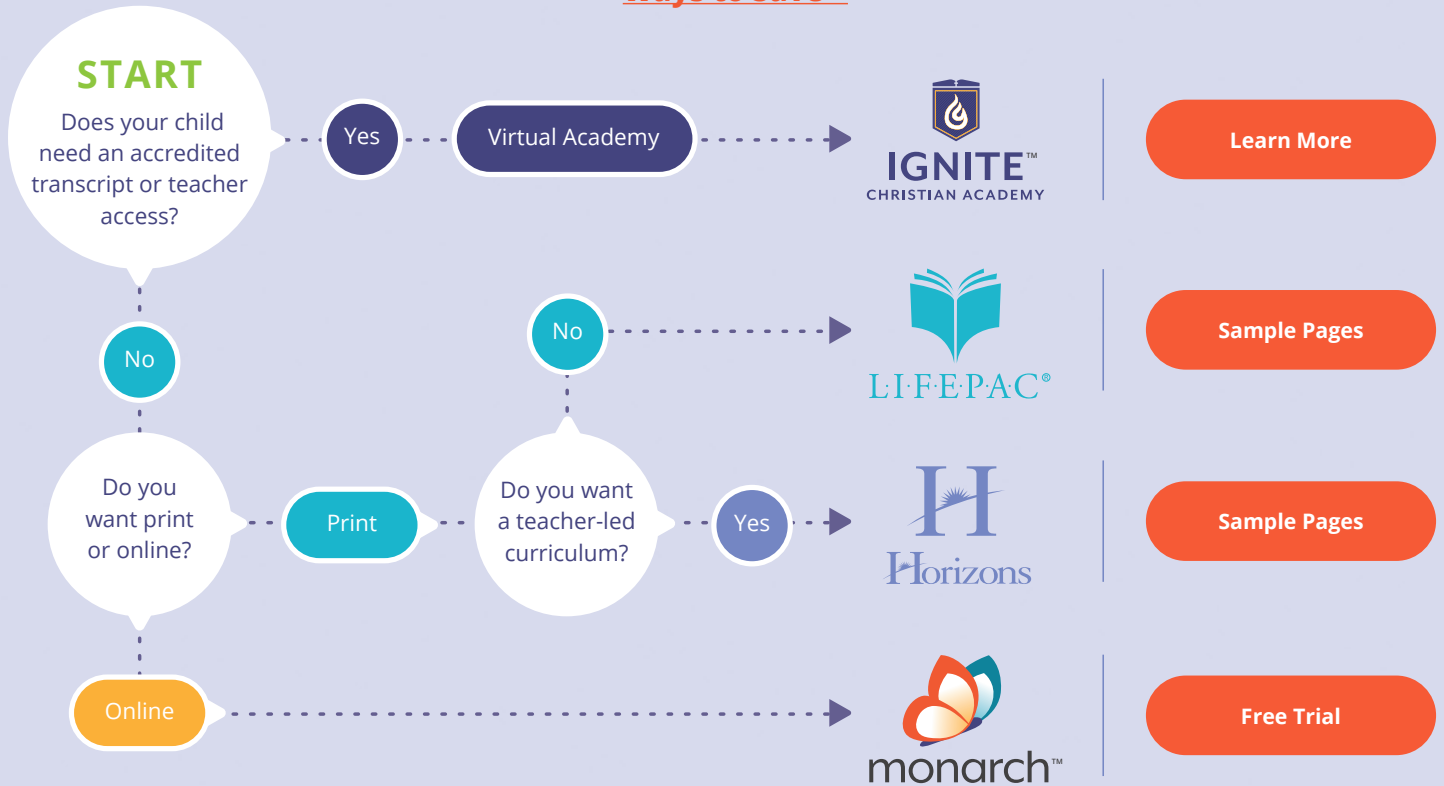

*No matter if you are a first-time homeschool parent or if you've been doing it for years, you may struggle with finding motivation during this slump, so here are a few ideas for how you can bring new life to your homeschool!*

## 1 TAKE YOUR SCHOOLING TO-GO.

Schedule field trips to museums, local service organizations, or even just to the library. A change of scenery can do wonders for inspiration during a slump.

Remember that reason and refocus on the bigger picture.



# Homeschool Field Trips

- ☐ Test scores

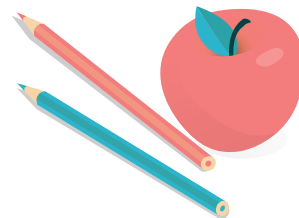


## ☐ **Give yourself a year-end review.**

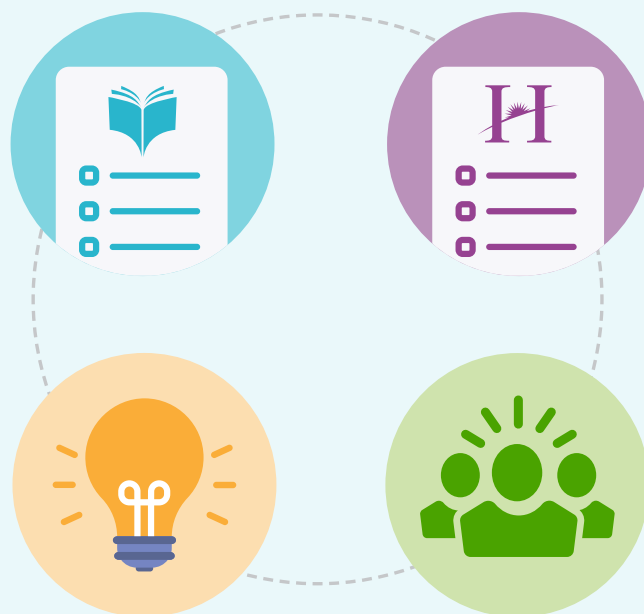
