Animals Live in Different Places

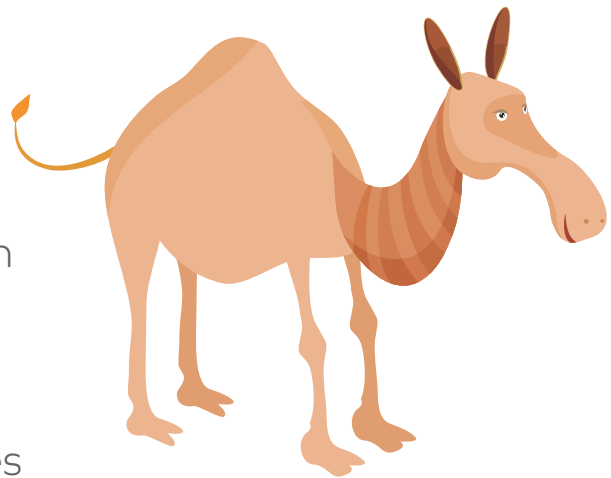
God has put animals all over the world. Some animals, such as the camel, live in the desert. A camel (cam el) can go without water for a long time. Very little water is in the desert.

Animals Have Different Coverings

Not all animals have the same covering. Each covering helps that animal to survive.

Birds have feathers to help them fly. The feathers are light. Air moves past the feathers swiftly.

Snakes have scales to make it easy to bend. They move smoothly along the ground.

A turtle (tur tle) carries his shell with him. He pulls his legs under the shell when danger is near.

Other animals have thick fur to keep them warm in winter. A cat grows thick fur before the cold weather starts.

The elephant has a thick skin to help him. He is so big that he can't hide easily. His tough skin must keep him safe.

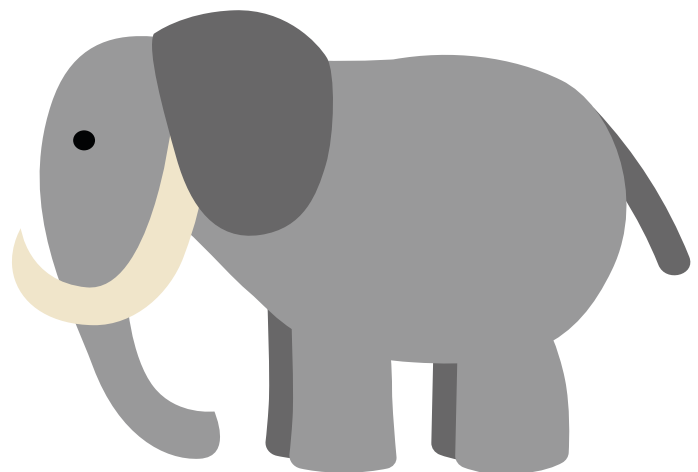
God has given each animal a covering to help keep that animal safe.

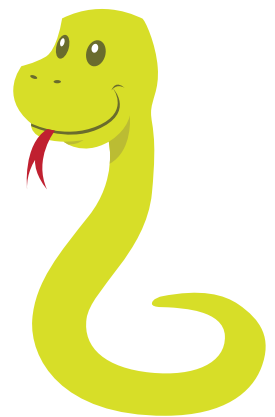

Animals Are Different Sizes and Shapes

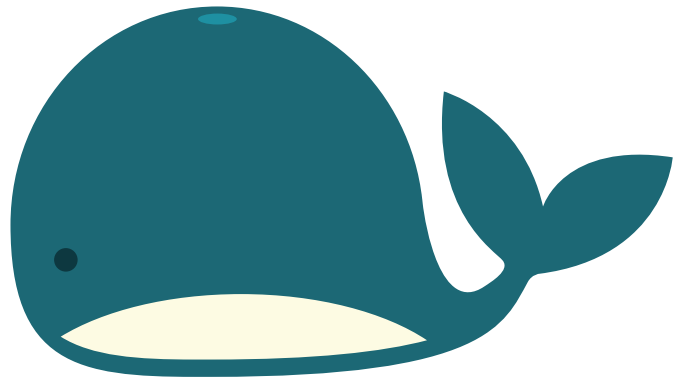
You will see in a zoo the many different sizes and shapes of animals that God has made.

The largest animal is the whale. You won't find a whale in a zoo. A whale is too large for a zoo. A whale must swim in the big sea. The largest whale is the blue whale. The blue whale is as large as ten trucks put end to end.

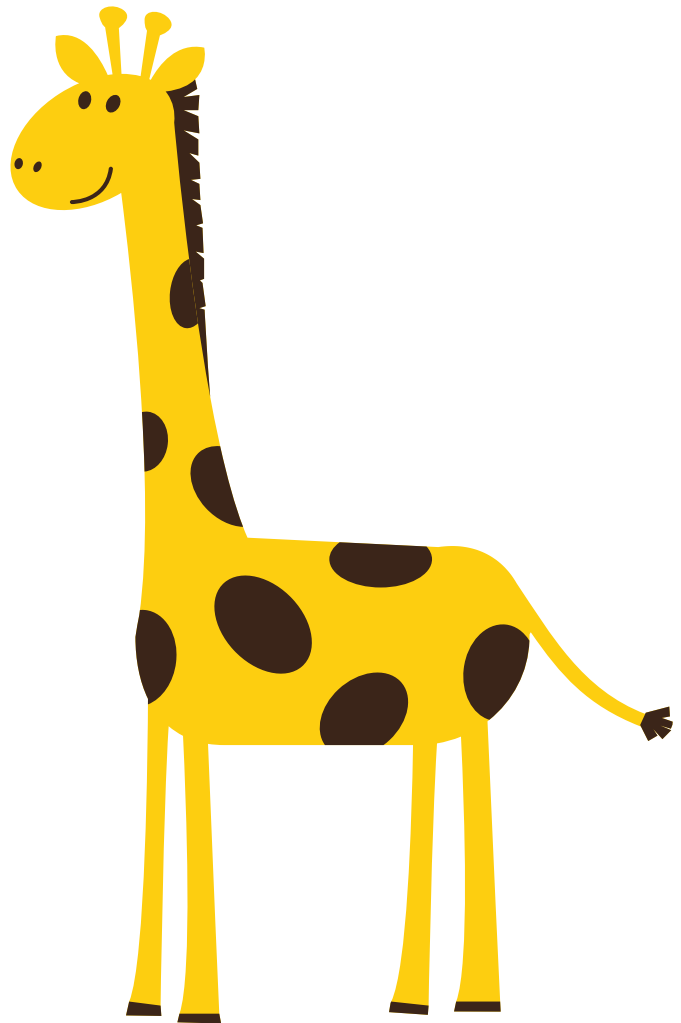
Another very large animal is the elephant. An elephant can be eleven feet tall and be as heavy as two or three small cars.

The giraffe (giraffe) is a tall animal. Since a giraffe stands twenty feet tall, a giraffe can eat leaves on the tops of trees.

Some animals are very big, but other animals are very little. The animals you saw in your microscope zoo are some of the smallest.

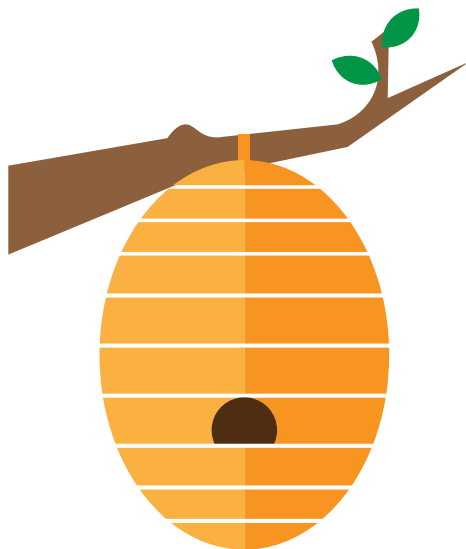

Animals must make or find their own homes, too. Animals use their homes as places to stay away from danger. Homes are used for sleeping. Animals can stay dry and warm in their homes. Animals need homes to raise their babies.



Most small animals make their homes in holes. A woodpecker (wood peck er) makes a hole in a tree trunk. A chipmunk (chip munk) likes a hole in a wall. In a hole in a beehive, you may find some bees. Some big animals live in large holes. A bear lives in a cave.
